

Two ways to embed the widget...

1. The first way is the easiest, and it's to include...

```
<script src="https://co2widget.com/build/widget.min.js" defer></script>
```

...in your HTML page, and then where you want to insert the widget, add:

```
<div id="czw" class="czw"></div>
```

This is not the best way of embedding the widget, as you won't have any control over the size of the widget, and from our side, we won't be able to cache the requests as easily.

2. The second way is technically much better...

Create an iframe with the src "https://co2widget.com/embed".

This is superior, as you can resize the iFrame as you wish, and all of the caching will work properly.

However, in order to make this second option work, you will need a local reverse proxy like nginx, because of the [Same-Origin Policy](#).
